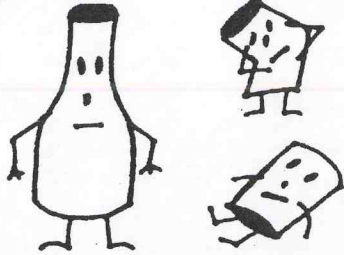

CAPE MAY POINT RECYCLES BY LAW

All residents and visitors shall recycle under local Ordinance #261-88; and in compliance with The Statewide Source Separation and Recycling Act.

DO RECYCLE PAPER

in red tote or paper bag

- Newspaper
- Office Paper
- Corrugated Boxes
- Magazines
- Junk Mail

CANS & BOTTLES

in red round container

- Aluminum Cans
- Glass Bottles (green, brown and clear)
- Plastic Bottles - with 1 or 2 imprinted on bottom
- Steel (Tin) Cans

RIGID & HARD PLASTICS

Toys • Flower Pots • Containers • Buckets • Furniture

YARD DEBRIS, LEAVES, GRASS CLIPPINGS

Co-mingle in brown paper bags

BRANCHES

Bundle in twine in 4-ft lengths

DO NOT RECYCLE PAPER

- Food Boxes - example: cereal, pasta & rice boxes, and egg cartons.
- Cardboard Beverage Carriers - example: soda and beer cartons.
- Tissue Paper, Paper Towels, Plates & Cups

CANS & BOTTLES

- Aluminum Foil
- Paint Cans
- Window Glass
- Cookware
- Plastic Storage Boxes
- Containers
- Pie Plates
- Pots & Pans
- Drinking Glasses
- Toys

Mandatory Recycling**Blue Diamond Disposal Inc.****(609) 861-4700**

Recycling placed at the curbside is picked-up every-other Monday except July and August when it is picked up every week. (Please see front) Red containers must be placed at curbside no earlier than 3 pm the day before pick-up, but must be out before 7 am the day of pick-up and returned to the side or rear of property no later than 7pm on the day of pick-up.

Items that must be recycled:

- Paper- Newspapers with inserts, magazines, office paper, junk mail, telephone books
- Glass, Food and Beverage Containers-
- Metal Food and Beverage Containers-
- Plastic Bottles and Jugs

Trash placed at the curbside is picked-up every Monday year-round. Trash containers must have secure lids and be placed at curbside no earlier than 3 pm the day before pick-up but must be out prior to pickup at 7 am. All trash containers must be returned to side or rear of property no later than 7 pm on the day of pick-up.

Leaves, Grass and Yard Debris

Leaves, grass and yard debris (smaller than your pinkie and compostable) can be combined and must be placed in brown paper bags for pick-up on Tuesdays. Brown paper bags can be purchased at a local hardware store or you can stop by the Public Works Building and pick up free bags for your use.

Branches

Branches cut into 4-foot lengths and bundled in twine may be placed at the curbside for pick-up on Wednesdays. Bundles may not weigh more than 40 lbs. each.

Christmas Trees

Christmas trees may be placed at curbside during the month of January and will be collected as needed.

Hard or Rigid Plastics

Hard or rigid plastics may be disposed of at the Public Works Bldg. in the container provided during hours to be posted.

Clothing

A clothing receptacle is located at the Public Works Bldg. (corner of Sunset Blvd. and Lighthouse Ave)

You are responsible to recycle the following items at the CMCMUA landfill:

- Brush & tree branches over 4-feet long
- Stumps
- Ferrous and non-ferrous scrap
- Electronic Waste
- Hazardous Materials- motor oil, kerosene, used oil filters, paint, solvents
- Tires
- Batteries
